We are so thankful for the gift of embryo donation. It has changed our lives forever. Through the miracle of receiving donated embryos, we now have our precious sons, Wynsten and Elias. We are so grateful to have the opportunity to be their parents. It truly is a dream come true.

Five years ago, when we got married and started trying to grow our family, we had no idea what lay ahead for us. We never could have imagined a more perfect outcome than having these two beautiful boys to raise, but the journey wasn't always easy. Shortly after our first wedding anniversary,

I was diagnosed with Premature Ovarian Failure. This meant that the chances of us getting pregnant spontaneously were extremely low. The diagnosis was a difficult reality to face. Although we had always dreamed of one day adopting, we just hadn't envisioned the timing being quite as it seemed it would be.

One day, while searching YouTube for information on adoption, I came across a video showing a family who were embryo recipients and gave birth to triplets. It was an incredible story, and we were very intrigued. We prayed that God would

show us if this was something we should pursue. A few months later, we had the opportunity to meet a baby born through the Beginnings embryo donation/recipient program. This solidified in our hearts our desire to grow our family through this unique and amazing means.

Please note that many of these now expectant families were once on our wait list, hoping to adopt a child and seized the opportunity to join our Embryo Program.

After completing the required paperwork and screening process with Beginnings, we excitedly put together our profile book and were thrilled to be presented with a number of different profiles. We considered all the profiles and felt drawn to two donors. We selected one and we were overjoyed when we received news that we had successfully been matched!

Our first match was of a group of 10 embryos that had been frozen for 24 years. We did get pregnant three times, but sadly none of those precious lives made it to our arms. That was a very challenging time. It was hard to not be discouraged, but we knew God had a plan in all of this. As a result of this experience, we learned to deeply appreciate how valuable each life is. There were times of great sorrow and depression, but we still had hope.

After taking time to grieve, we contacted Mary to ask if we could try again. It certainly was not easy to open our hearts again, since knowing the reality of loss all too clearly. We were amazed to find out that after over a year, the second profile we had considered the first time was still available! We will forever be so thankful to the

beautiful family that allowed us to have the opportunity to give these babies a home. We received six special embryos, frozen for 15 years. On the day of the transfer, our doctor met with us to discuss the current embryo report after our embryos had been thawed and grown in the lab for two days. The news was not as good as we had hoped: two of our embryos had not survived the thaw; two were still at day 3 development (2 days behind); and two had made it to the morula stage but on the day of transfer should have been blastocysts. Due to the delay in development and grading of our embryos, the doctor recommended we transfer both morula embryos as our chances of pregnancy were quite low. We prayed for the future of these babies, but it certainly was not easy. Five days later, I took a test and, to my amazement, two pink lines appeared!! We were thrilled, God had answered our prayers!

After our history of loss, it was hard to not worry, and at six weeks, I had a terrible scare while at work. We thought the pregnancy may be over but prayed for a miracle. A couple of days later, I went in for my first ultrasound and got the biggest shock of my life. Not one

but TWO heartbeats appeared on the screen. We just about passed out with the utter joy and surprise we felt in that moment!

Pregnancy was amazing. Of course it came with it's challenges, but to have the opportunity to grow my babies in my womb was incredible. I loved feeling them kick and respond to our voices as we would sing them "Jesus Loves Me". What a privilege to be able to carry and grow my children and to experience the beauty and magic of childbirth.

Our miracle twin boys are now five months old and learning and growing bigger with each day. We are forever grateful to our donor family, who have been so supportive from the beginning. They are encouraging and caring in any way we need. They are open to being as involved as we are comfortable. It is so nice to have a family with similar values to us. We want our children to have the opportunity to meet and learn about their genetic siblings and we believe having an open relationship will be very important for our children's development so that they can know they have always been loved from the very beginning of their journey.


## Thank You for Your Support in 2021!


